## Fulfilling the first two objects of Kiwanis

Here are the first two Objects of Kiwanis:

1. To give primacy to the human and spiritual rather than to the material values of life.
2. To encourage the daily living of the Golden Rule in all human relationships.

We do a pretty good job of fulfilling these two objects in our local clubs, but could we do more?

One of the "standing committees" recommended for all clubs is *The Committee on Human and Spiritual*

*Values.*  
Here is the description of that committee:  
*The Committee on Human and Spiritual Values* should implement projects that support spiritual development, provide human companionship and comfort, or offer counseling and guidance. Projects can encourage interfaith and interdenominational religious activity, such as prayer, but should not support a specific religious sect. Popular projects include prayer breakfasts, layman of the year awards, transportation to religious services, visits to nursing homes, and support of grief counseling.

Here are a few suggestions to get us thinking about fulfilling the "spiritual" part of these objects.

**Host a community Prayer Breakfast** – perhaps joining together with other clubs in your community.

Back in November the Kiwanis Cal-Nev-Ha Foundation broke ground on our new office building in beautiful downtown Rancho Cucamonga. Soon Pete and the Kiwanis District Office will be headquartered there as the first tenant. Since the building will house 12,500 square feet of prime office space we'll be leasing to outside commercial organizations, bringing additional income to the Foundation. You can purchase one or more "Building Bonds" (5 year bonds paying 5.5% interest, minimum purchase of \$5,000 each); purchase one or more "Building Bricks" (available in \$150, \$250, or \$1,000 increments); or you might want to make a contribution of any amount towards the new Kiwanis Building. As we once said, "We Build."

You'll note that I've had some wonderful help from Morrie Pike (aka Captain Book) and the ever-loving Kathy Meyers with her trusty knitting needles. this is top priority in our minds. One large advantage we have is the number of people who were exposed to Kiwanis at the POINSETTIA BOWL GAME on December 19th. A number of inquiries have already been received from interested parties and forwarded to appropriate clubs for follow up. Let's keep the momentum moving ahead!! Contact either myself or MAJID AZIMI our Division Coordinator for Membership by the 15th of January so scheduling of training can be finalized. One half day is all the time needed to pass this knowledge on and get recruitment moving forward.

Another goal we have is to increase both our SERVICE HOURS and FUNDS raised to assist our communities in the best manner. Increasing our contact with community leaders will put us in position to increase Service Hours by a total of 500 hours in each club. December will be a good example in how far this has come. In addition when we publicize our efforts, the residents of each town will feel more comfortable in donating materials and dollars to increase our fund raising by an average in excess of \$3200 per club. This is our target for the year. The next 4 to 5 months are critical in determining how successful 2006-2007 will be. **TOGETHER WE CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN OUR COMMUNITIES** and fulfill our defining statement to its fullest.
